#### I. Certainty is a choice.

A. We choose it by controlling what we value.

Finally brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is commendable—if there is any moral excellence and if there is anything praiseworthy—dwell on these things. Phil. 4:8

B. We choose it by recognizing the <u>true enemy</u>.

For although we live in the flesh, we do not wage war according to the flesh, since the weapons of our warfare are not of the flesh but are powerful through God for the demolition of strongholds. We demolish arguments and every proud thing that is raised up against the knowledge of God, and we take every thought captive to obey Christ. 1 Cor. 10:3-5

#### II. Certainty is a habit.

- A. Certainty in the life of a believer makes God <u>proud</u>. (1:6-9; Matt. 25:23)
